

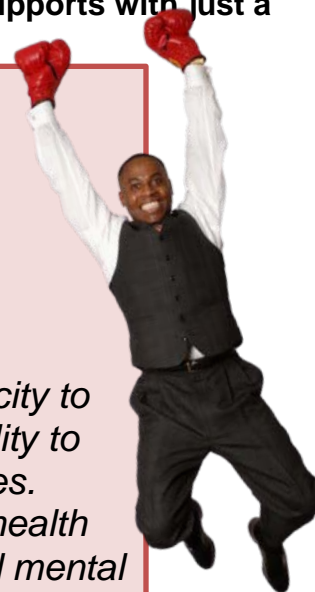
IU13 LIVE Virtual Transition to Post-Secondary Education Fair
