Tim Talk

IU13 Community Education Program Director

We recently received \$25,000 in funding through the Lancaster County Community Foundation's (LCCF) Community Bridge Builders program to support the work of the Lancaster County Re-Entry Coalition. IU13 chairs the Coalition's Education, Employment, and Training impact group, which zeroed in on the need for reentry roundtable discussions.

The roundtables will provide employers and HR professionals with an opportunity to discuss the challenges of hiring individuals after incarceration. Some employers won't hire reentrants even though the job might be a good fit. At the same time,



reentrants and individuals supporting them in finding jobs might not have a complete understanding of employers' concerns with hiring reentrants. We are so grateful for LCCF funding which will help bridge the gap between employers and reentrants.

Student Success Story: Patricia Roldan



In 1996, Colombian, South America native Patricia Roldan had the opportunity to immigrate to the United States. She understood no English other than her name and country. She learned about IU13 from her brother, and when she moved to Pennsylvania to live with friends, she signed up for classes.

Patricia enrolled in English as a Second Language (ESL) as well as High School Equivalency (HSE/GED), where she met her former teacher, Tim Shenk, whom she's still in contact with today.

When she lived in Columbia, Patricia worked in Hospital Administration and integrative medicine,

but when she came to the United States her education and experience weren't

recognized. She had to learn another profession to be able to sustain herself. This dedication and drive led her to a job as a Registered Nurse (RN) with a diploma from the former Lancaster General Hospital School of Nursing. With a personal healthcare philosophy based on mental and physical wellness, Patricia chose to start her own business: Compassionate Touch Nursing Care, LLC. She took her love of people and passion for being a nurse to help those in need, integrating what she'd learned from her home country.

Patricia's hope is to create awareness for immigrants and challenge them to achieve their career goals, regardless of their situation. When asked what advice she would give to potential adult learners, she said, "Reach out to IU13 and learn the language. Commitment pays off."
