ES – The History and Wisdom of Native Americans (Face to Face)

Description of Seminar: SEE students love exploring nature at Lancaster County Central Park. With Naturalist, Lisa Sanchez, students learn while hiking, often asking questions and discussing a variety of things while out in the woods. In addition to a rich environmental experience, there is much history to explore at the park. This seminar will offer a glimpse at the Native Americans from the Susquehannock tribe who lived in this park in the 1700s. We will visit a burial site located along Golf Road and learn how this tribe used plants and trees for food and tools. Students will also learn tracking skills and play games once enjoyed by the Native Americans. At many SEE Seminars in the park we touch on things learned from Native Americans, but this seminar will focus very specifically on many aspects of local Native American history that still impact things we do today. Please dress for an outdoor experience and be sure to wear sturdy shoes for hiking. A park waiver will allow those who are interested to taste approved edibles as part of the seminar experience.

Description of Seminar: Do you love spending time outside? Are you fascinated with nature and the changing seasons? Do you enjoy listening, watching, and appreciating wildlife, trees, waterways, and flowers? If your answer is yes, this seminar is for you! Come and learn how spending time outside can calm you down. Description of Seminar: Quick, observe what's around you. Did you see shapes, colors, objects, or pictures? Visual elements and images are all around us. Visual elements (line, shape, color, texture, space, form) are a tool that artists, designers, markets, illustrators, and even YOU, use to communicate. There is no escaping visuals,

which is why it's important to learn how to read them and how to use them to strengthen your message or story.

In this workshop, you'll practice communicating an idea or feeling through shape and color. You'll see how illustrators use shape and color to communicate ideas, and you'll develop your visual literacy skills.

Description of Seminar: What if you couldn't just run to the grocery store to fill the kitchen table with food? Would you be able to take barren soil and create a garden to sustain your nutritional needs? Is it important to understand where our food comes from and the science behind growing the food we need to survive? How does growing food impact our environment? These are a few topics to be explored at this SEE seminar. Throughout the day, you will dig in the dirt, focus on the concept of "food-to-table," discover what lives in a garden, and explore the impact of food production on the environment. Whether considering large scale agriculture or backyard gardens, important scientific concepts are vital to success. Arrive ready for discussion, hiking, and getting your hands dirty!
