They will learn the differences between living and deceased donation and gain the confidence to address common questions and misconceptions about organ and tissue donation. Participants will also have access to downloadable classroom resources and activities designed for students in grades 9–12, making it easy to bring this important topic into meaningful, age-appropriate classroom conversations and curriculum.



As an added benefit, participants will be introduced to an IU13 grant opportunity that can provide funding and support for bringing organ and tissue donation education directly into their classrooms.
